Through her eyes, field hockey was more than a game, it was a medium to nurture young minds to become better individuals on and off the field. Her mantra still sticks with me daily "believe in the dream, achieve the goal."

It's not just North Conway Community Center Sports Programs that helped shape me into who I am today... My first paycheck bore the emblem of the snack shack on the playground here, a humble yet sweet beginning to my working life. Fast forwarding to college, an internship opportunity here presented itself, allowing me to contribute to ideas for future youth programming. It was a full circle moment - from being someone who benefited from these programs, to being able to help shape the future of them.

As an adult - I am still called back to this community at least once a year for Mud Bowl. For people in my life who are unfamiliar with the event, I understand it can be an odd thing to prioritize coming home for. But to me, it's an event that underscores the fun nature of the North Conway Community as a whole and I feel lucky to be a participant in the fan fare every year following in my Mom's footsteps.

Over 75 years, the North Conway Community Center has come a long way. The unveiling of the new building wasn't just a physical expansion; it symbolized the growing aspirations and capabilities of our community. Now we are able to welcome even more groups of all ages to gather, interact, and create lasting memories.
